

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Background

Beverley Barracudas recognise that anyone may have the potential to abuse children in some way. Children are abused regardless of age, racial origin, ability or sexual identity. It is important; therefore, to have in place a policy that will ensure unsuitable people are prevented from working with children. Also, that staff whether paid or working in a voluntary capacity have a basic knowledge and understanding of child protection and how to respond to allegations of abuse.

Policy Statement

Beverley Barracudas will:

- Accept the moral and legal responsibility to implement procedures to provide a duty of care for children, safeguard their well-being and protect them from abuse.
- Respect and promote the rights, wishes and feelings of children.
- Recruit, train and supervise its employees and volunteers to adopt best practice to safeguard and protect children from abuse and themselves against potentially false allegations.
- Respond to any allegations appropriately and implement the appropriate disciplinary and appeals procedures.
- A child is defined as anyone under 18 years of age (The Children Act 1989).

The guidance given in the procedures is based on the following principles:

- The welfare of children and young people is paramount.
- All children regardless of culture, ability, gender, language, racial origin, religious belief and/or sexual identify have the right to protection from abuse.
- It is the responsibility of Social Services to determine whether or not abuse has taken place, but it is everyone's responsibility to report any concerns.
- All reported incidents of poor practice and allegations should be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately.

Staff Knowledge and Understanding

All staff working fully, part-time or in a voluntary capacity will be made aware of this policy.

Minimum Operating Standards

As a minimum operating standard all staff and volunteers working with children will have the opportunity to be working towards achieving the following training:

- Child Protection awareness and training
- First Aid
